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

- Applicants must attach photocopies of their original birth certificates or international passport data page.







The donation of the books was received by the Rising Star Secondary School Director Mrs. Fransisca Matay on behalf of the school management.








Read Africa - Kenya






Read Africa - Zambia

UBA Foundation also sponsors several skills acquisition and empowerment conferences, workshops, and seminars.



Due to the lockdown and stay at home orders, we created the online platform and encouraged staff to sign up to teach their peers a variety of skills online.




Each One Teach One - Benin


- As part of the Each one Teach one programme, three (3) UBA staff members volunteered to give free training in .


- \$2.8 million USD (N1 billion) to Lagos State Government in Nigeria

- \$2.8 million USD (N1 billion) to the remaining 35 states in Nigeria
- \$4.2 million USD (N1.5 billion) to UBA's presence countries in Africa
- \$2.8 million USD (N4billion) for Medical Centers with equipment and supplies


Covid-19 Relief (Lagos State)






















Special Projects
