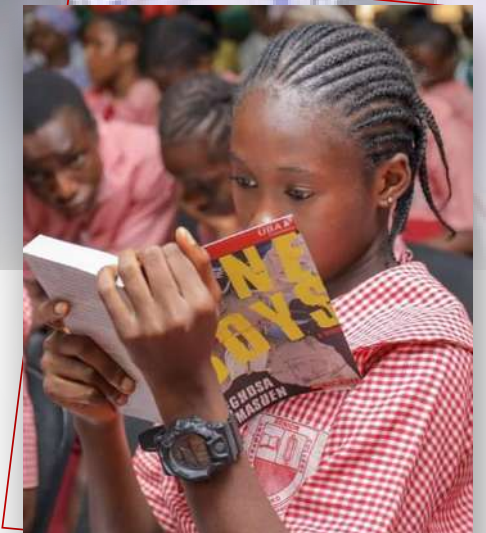

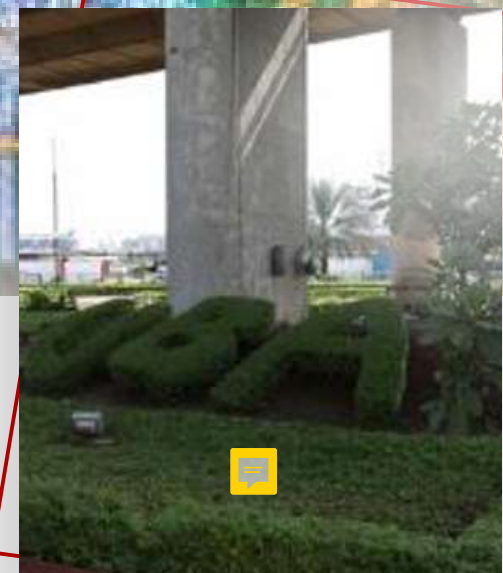

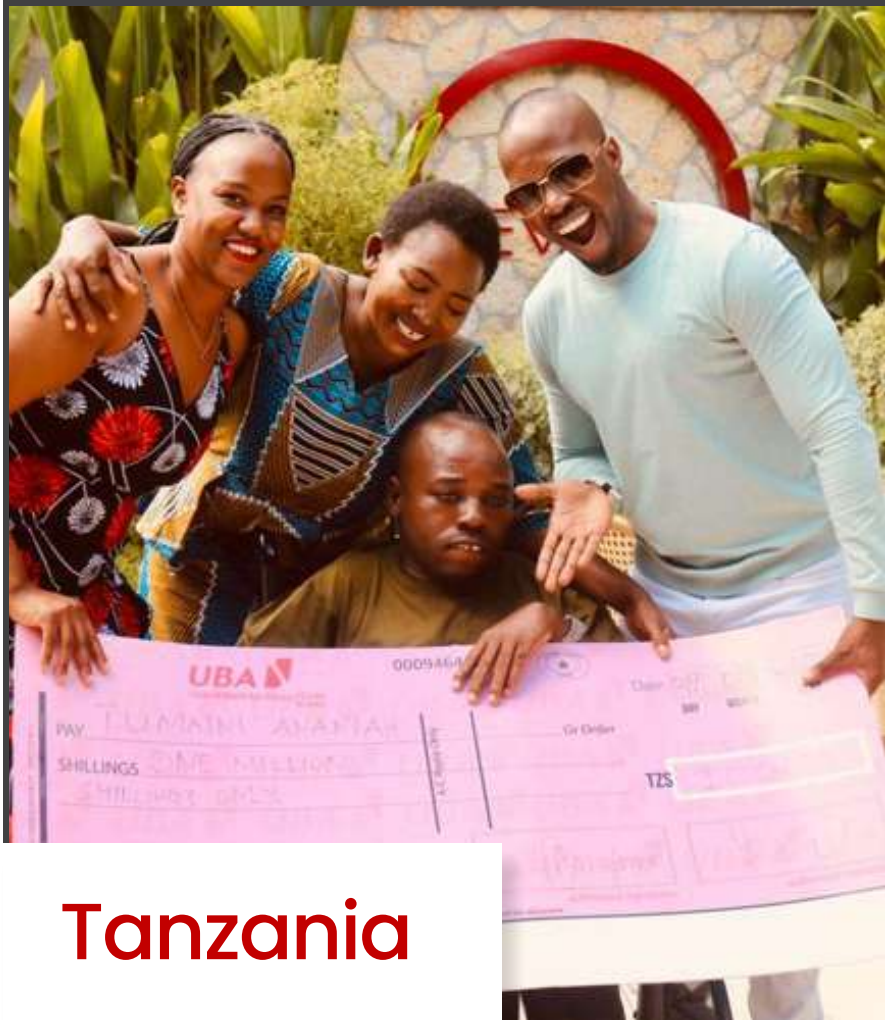
Sierra Leone

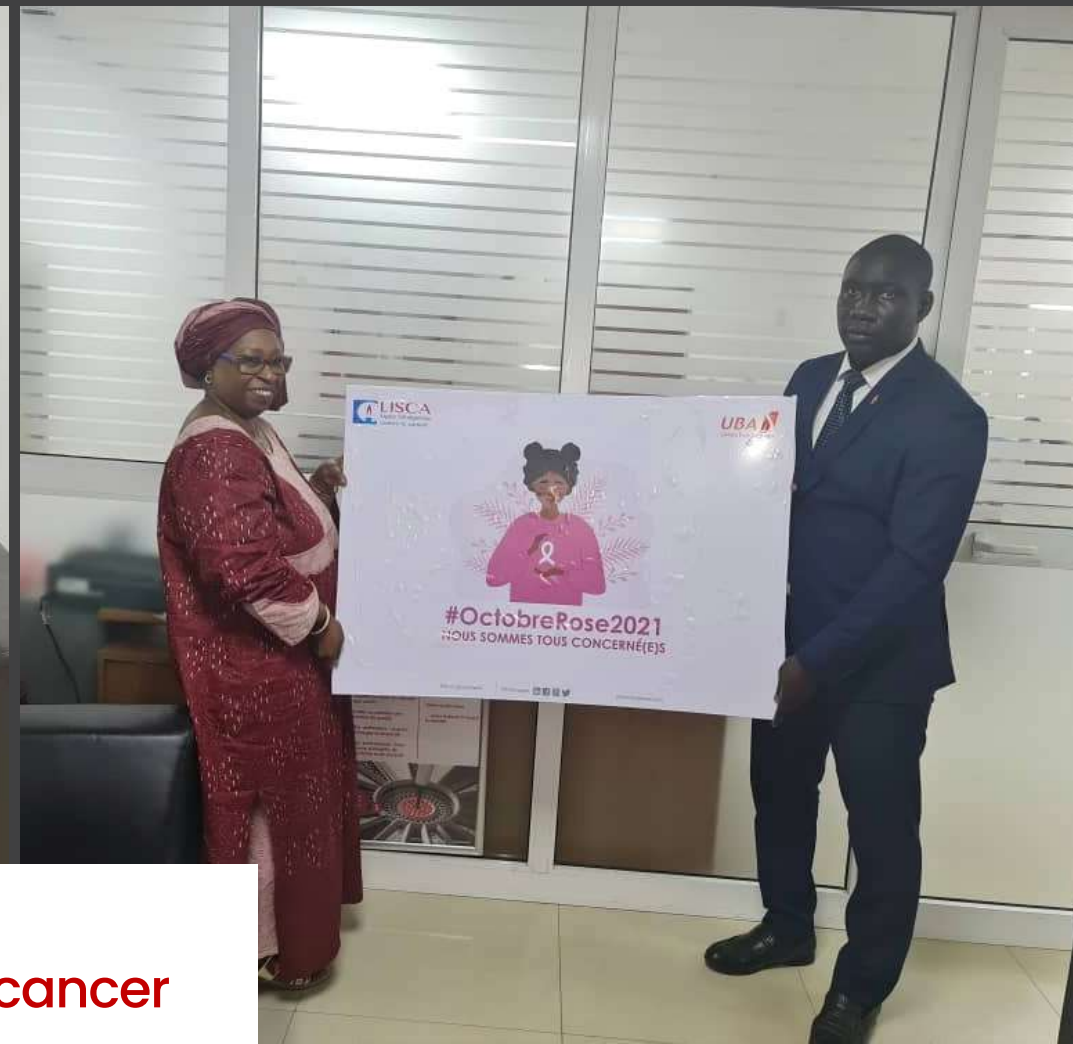
