The UBA Foundation hosted the 2022 edition of the National Essay Competition, which is targeted at senior secondary school students in Africa. This programme is part of the Foundation's education initiative to promote literacy and encourage healthy and intellectual competition among secondary school students in Nigeria and across Africa.

The National Essay Competition was birthed in 2011 and since then has been replicated in several countries across the UBA Group. Post Covid-19 Pandemic the National Essay Competition Initiative became revised and the Foundation decided it would be more acceptable online. In 2022, all applications were submitted and judged virtually.

There was a significant 40% increase in total prize money awarded. The grant also awarded for this year's competition is as follows:

1st place- N5 million educational grant.

2nd place- N3 million educational grant.

3rd place- N2.5 million educational grant.

On Monday 14th of November 2022, the UBA Foundation hosted the grand finale of the 12th edition of the National Essay competition at the Tony Elumelu Amphitheatre, UBA House, in Lagos, Nigeria.

15-year old Usungobong Paul, emerged as the overall winner of the Nigeria edition of the 2022 UBA Foundation's annual National Essay Competition. She walked away with a 5 million Naira scholarship to study at any African University of her choice to study.

The second prize was awarded to Princess Sholabomi, who won N3,000,000 in educational grant and a laptop, whilst the third prize of N2,500,000 and a brand-new laptop went to 15-year-old Sharon Nwajiaku.

Guinea


NEC Kickoff in Uganda

The winner Amumpaire Hanah Terisah of Ndejje SSS received a UGX 3,500,000 scholarship and a Laptop. Mr Kimara Jonathan of Bishop Cipriano Kihangire emerged as the 1st runner-up and recipient of a laptop. Mr Odeke Richard Ekituno of Jinja College emerged as the 2nd runner-up and also was rewarded with a Laptop.



Sierra Leone



UBA Sierra Leone in collaboration with the Ministry of Basic and Senior School Education, launched the 3rd edition of the National Essay Competition in Sierra Leone.

The topic for the year's essay was "Transforming Education requires collective effort including that of families and communities. Discuss specific interventions from families and or communities that can improve the quality of education."

The competition for Senior Secondary School students was aimed to enhance their writing and analytical skills, and to stand a chance to win scholarships of up to Le 50 000,000.





Read Africa is an initiative of the UBA Foundation, geared towards rekindling the dwindling reading culture among African youths. Our children no longer read; their passion for reading informative and educational books is fast eroding.

In response to the declining culture of reading in postprimary institutions across the continent, UBA Foundation created the 'Read Africa' Initiative. This year, the Foundation donated over 20,000 books to youths across the continent.

We have also resumed the physical Read Africa programme in schools and community centres, donating books, and educational materials to schools, community centres, and libraries group-wide.

Lagos







Tanzania



Zambia





GARDEN LIGHTING CEREMONY





Liberia


